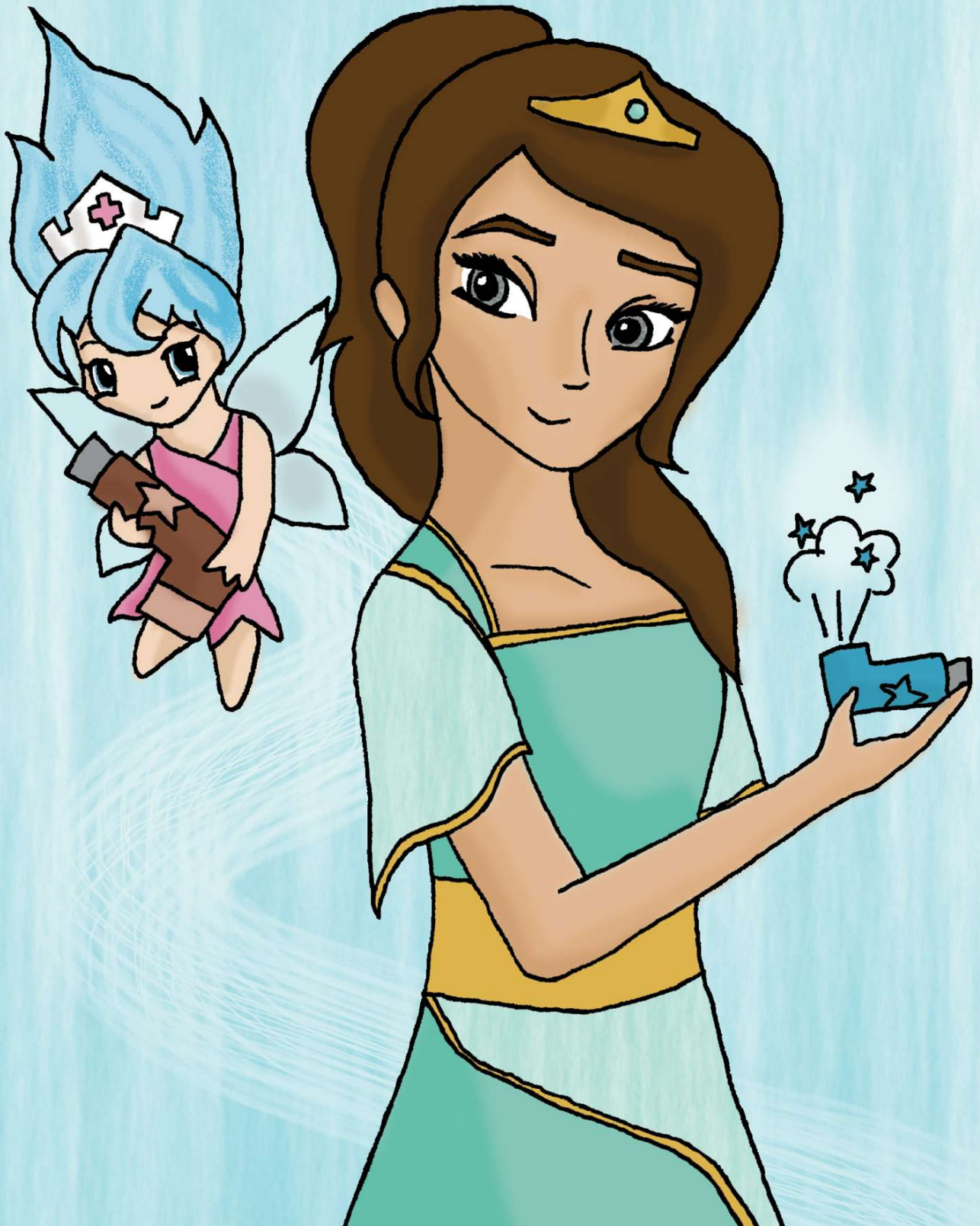

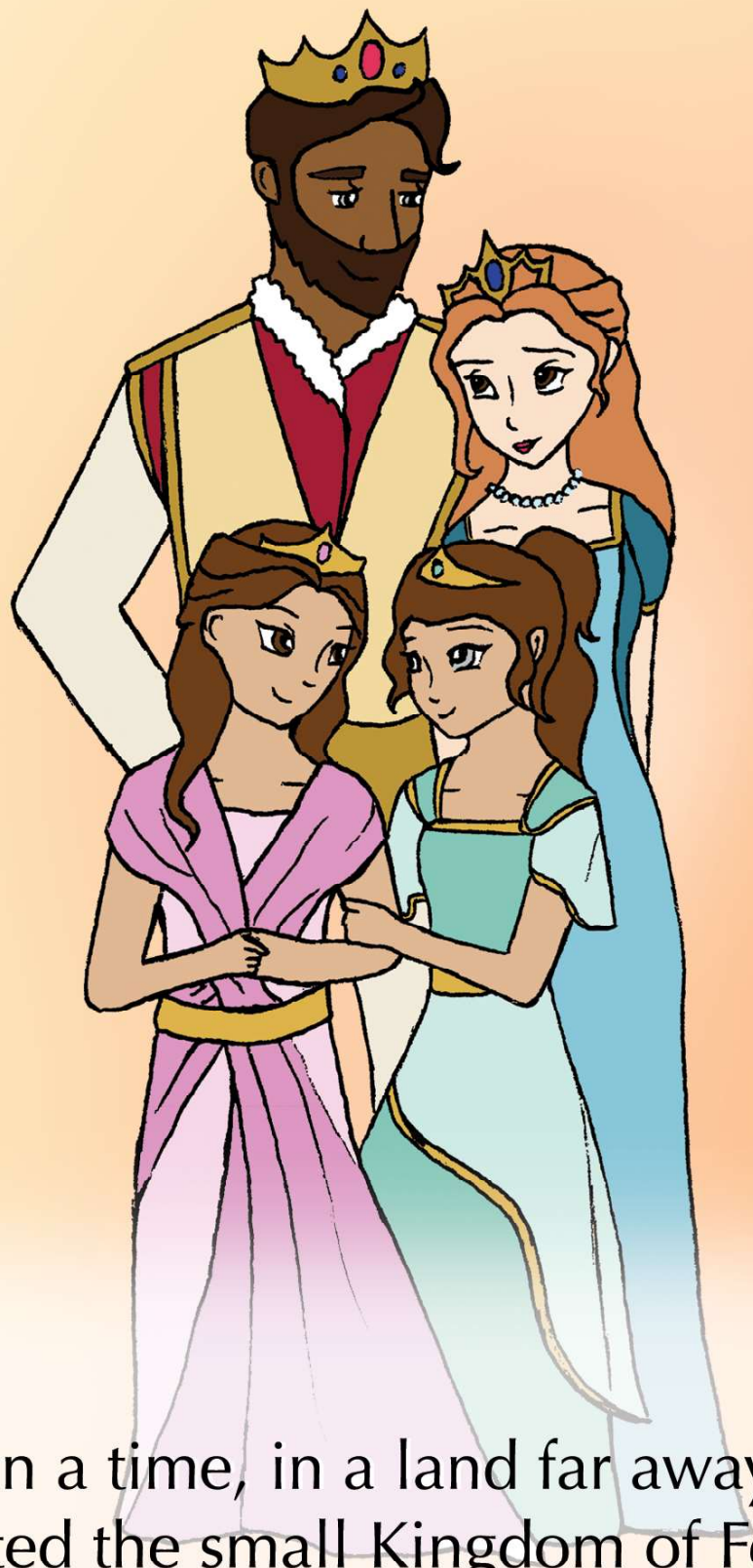

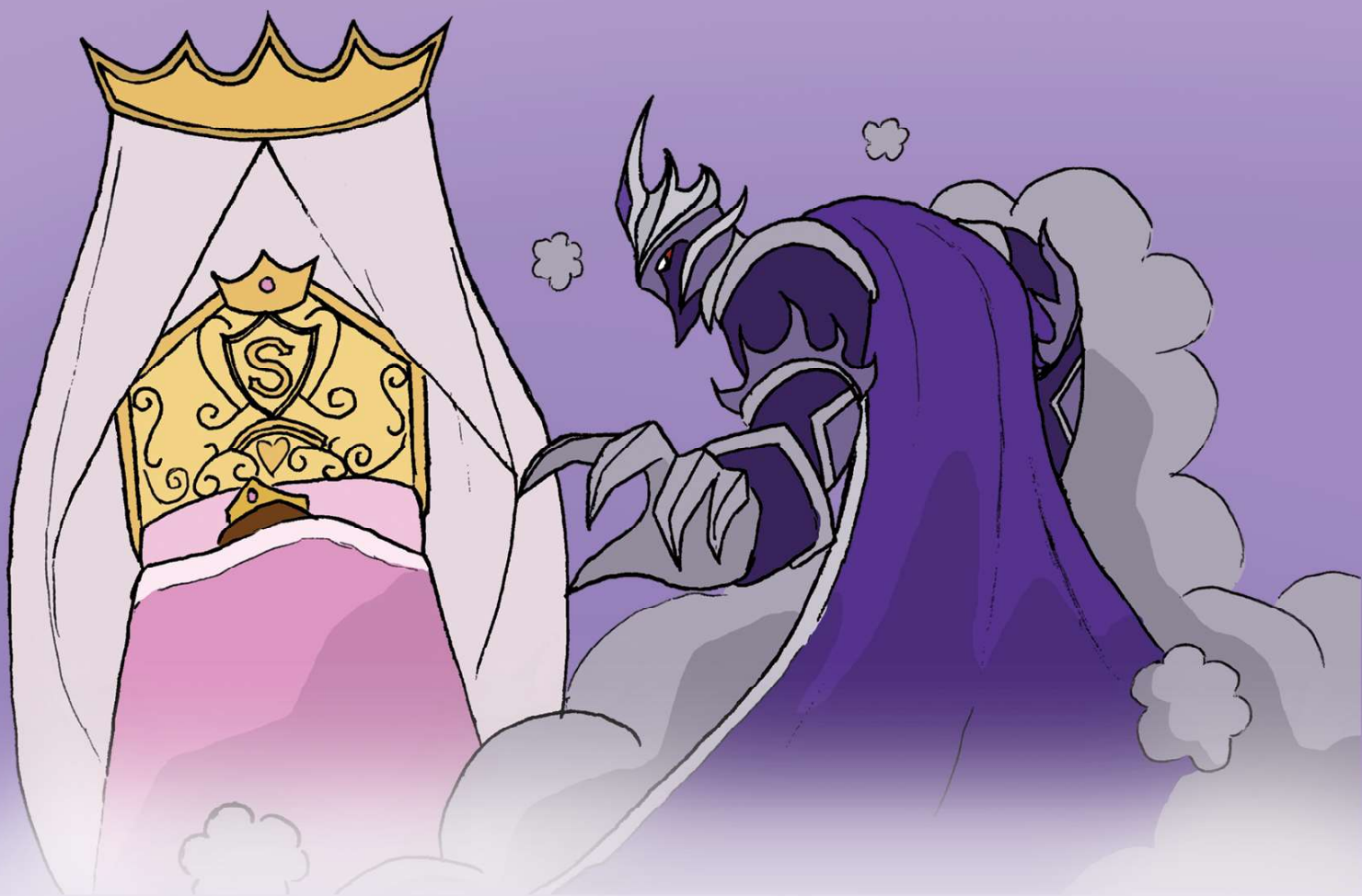

When someone has asthma they can sometimes have trouble breathing. Their airways narrow and they become breathless and wheezy. This is called an asthma attack.

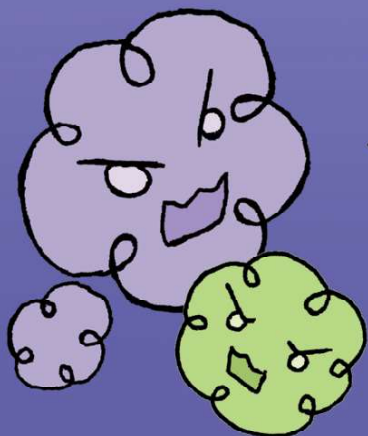


The Dust King might try to trap you and cause an asthma attack, by using the triggers of asthma. Triggers are those things that make you have an asthma attack if you breathe them in.

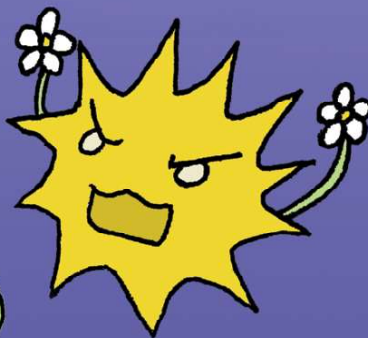
Remember that infections, exercise, and cold weather can also cause an asthma attack!

Fur and dander

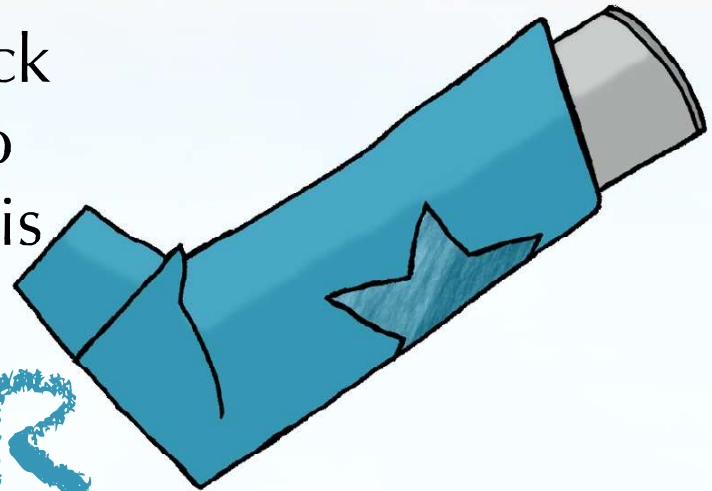
If someone has asthma,

To help children use the magic inhalers,  
we have a spectacular spacer.  
We put the inhaler on one end  
and breathe from the other end,  
so that the magic medicine from  
the inhaler can go into our  
lungs and help  
us breathe.







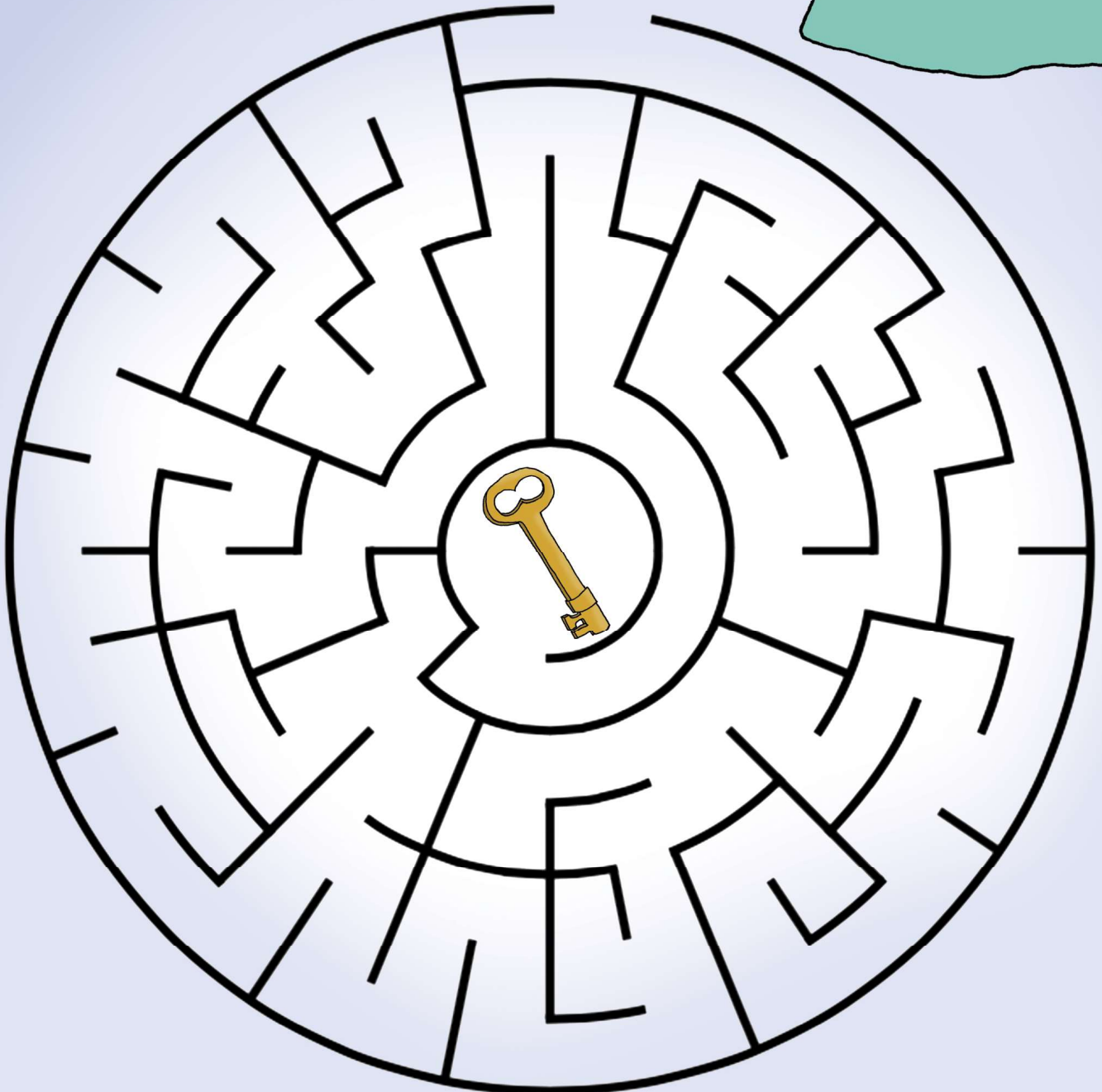

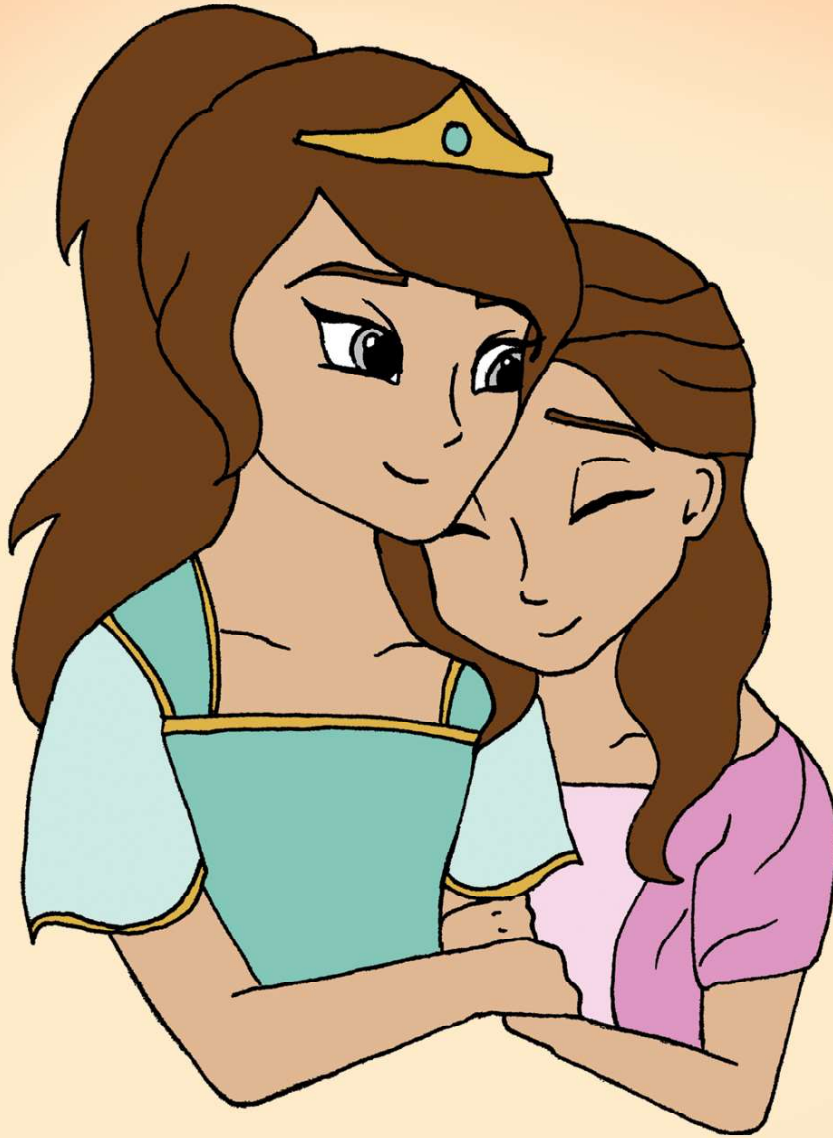


The brave Princess quickly remembered what her Pixie had told her to do in an asthma attack, and took her BLUE inhaler.

- Coughing

- Sit them up and slightly forward

**Medicine**



- Use blue inhaler
- Shake inhaler
- Place in spacer
- Spray one puff
- Take five breaths
- Repeat the above up to 10 times if needed
- If no improvement, call an ambulance

 Is this an emergency?

**E**  
**Emergency**  
**999**

- If no improvement, or if you are worried or unsure, call 999
- Call parent/guardian
- If ambulance takes longer than 10 mins, repeat Medicine steps
- Note time of calling 999
